## A Village in the City: Highbury Park, London

Today's house tour is straight from Highbury, London; an eclectic area rich with history and character. Highbury Barn life in the 1700s was referred to as a 'cakes and ale' resort, an escape from the noise of the inner city. Today it remains an idyllic village in the city providing green space, unique shops and restaurants.



The Loxford's is a three acre historic site located in Highbury Park that was built in the early 19th century, a stunning example of Regency style architecture. Suna Interior Design partnered with the Mount Anvil development team of craftsmen who restored Loxford House to its original glory. our tour will take place in the townhouse collection. The brick and stone exterior radiates period appeal, while the interior is sleek and modern boasting an open plan concept and high end finishes throughout. An eclectic blend of old world charm and modern design.







Mirroring the architecture and surroundings, the stage has been set for a modern interior with touches of vintage charm. Above an accent wall of wallpaper adds depth and pattern while bi-fold doors allow the outside in, extending the living space seamlessly.







Black and white has been used throughout the interior adding to the modern design elements of the sleek staircase and contemporary furnishings. A large scale mirror in the foyer and a gilded upholstered headboard in the bedroom add to the vintage design elements keeping with the historic character of the property.
