there's a new love for an eclectic style, full of flea market finds and reminiscent of apartments in New York's Greenwich Village. Rebecca Tucker, Director of Suna Interior Design (www.sunainteriordesign.com), thinks that we should be the curators of our own, mismatched home. She says, Furniture styles are going back to more handmade, one-off unique pieces, rather than high gloss, hard and minimal. Spend a bit more on one piece and mix it in with "found" objects. You can also trawl the internet, antiques shops and boutique stores. Colours don't need to be over-coordinated or "just so." Opt for a more collected, carefully combined arrangement of textures

and finishes. Handmade or bespoke digitally-printed wallpapers, unique prints, original art, vintage lighting and hand-picked exquisite accessories combine to ensure a space that's as individual as you.'

10. And finally... a very cool christmas

Plan ahead for a snow-bound Christmas. Festive decorating this year takes its cue from luxury ski lodges. 'The winterland trend conjures images of the rugged and icy Arctic landscape,' says Lisa Rutherford, seasonal homewares buyer at John Lewis. 'Christmas homes look fantastic dressed in cool, minimal white, tempered by the use of natural materials such as wool, wood and wicker in a look that blends the modern with the homespun. Perfect for wrapping up in chunky knits in front of the fire.' Get the look with a snow-capped tree dotted with twinkling white lights, a log basket, piles of tartan blankets on the sofa, and white-wrapped gift boxes. For Christmas lunch, you could dress the table in pure white linen, with snowy pom-poms and silver candles grouped together with fresh dark green foliage from the garden. A witty set of faux deer antlers on the wall will complete the Christmas-in-Gstaad look. ●
